

2022-23 SEASON – COVID-19 PREVENTION MEASURES

During the 2022-23 season, Antarctica21 will operate trips starting or ending in different ports: Port Stanley, in the Falkland Islands (Malvinas); Ushuaia, in Argentina; and Punta Arenas, in Chile. Travelers should review the Covid-19 Prevention Measures applicable to their itinerary.

PORT STANLEY, THE FALKLAND ISLANDS

Participation

To participate in a 2022-23 trip with Antarctica21 starting in the Falklands (Malvinas), guests must:

- Meet the entry requirement of the countries visited during the itinerary
- Be fully vaccinated against Covid-19. At least one booster dose is also recommended.
- Complete Antarctica21's participation form no later than July 30, 2022
- Purchase medical travel insurance, including emergency evacuation and Covid-related events

Covid-19 Prevention measures

Before embarkation on Day 1 of the trip, travelers will be asked to provide details of their physical condition and of their travel history for the previous 14 days. Guests who report any Covid symptoms, may be required to take a Covid test that will be provided by Antarctica21.

Guests with a positive test result will need to isolate on board the ship for a minimum of 5 days until a subsequent test is negative, or for a maximum of 7 days, whichever occurs first. Cabin mate(s) must isolate for 3 days while taking daily tests. A monitoring scheme will be applied to any close contacts of the individual who tested positive. The monitoring scheme will include use of a face mask, mandatory physical distancing, both indoors and outdoors, and daily testing.

USHUAIA, ARGENTINA and PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE

Participation

To participate in a 2022-23 trip starting or ending in Punta Arenas or Ushuaia, guests must:

- Meet the entry requirements of the countries visited during the itinerary
- Be fully vaccinated against Covid-19. At least one booster dose is also recommended.
- Complete Antarctica21's participation form no later than 120 days prior to departure
- Purchase medical travel insurance, including emergency evacuation and Covid related events

Covid-19 Prevention measures

On Day 1 of the trip, before embarkation travelers will be asked to provide details of their physical condition and of their travel history for the previous 14 days. Guests who report any Covid symptoms, may be requested to take a Covid test that will be provided by Antarctica21. Guests with a positive test result and their accommodation companions (cabin mate, hotel room mate) will not be admitted on the trip. Close contacts not sharing the same accommodation will be admitted on the trip subject to a monitoring scheme. The monitoring scheme will include use of a face mask, mandatory physical distancing, both indoors and outdoors, and daily testing during a period of 3 days.

Guests reporting any Covid symptoms during the cruise must take a Covid test that will be provided by Antarctica21. Guests with a positive test result will need to isolate for a minimum of 5 days until a subsequent test is negative, or for a maximum of 7 days, whichever occurs first. Cabin mate(s) must isolate for 3 days while taking daily tests. A monitoring scheme will be applied to any close contacts of the individual who tested positive. The monitoring scheme will include use of a face mask, mandatory physical distancing, both indoors and outdoors, and daily testing.
